






Rural Realities

SORC Recommendations

- 1. For senior governments, we need a new and robust vision and policy framework for rural Canada
- Rural communities themselves must be active participants in understanding, planning and investing in their own futures
- 3. For all Canadians, with the recent release of the findings of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada Report, there is a window of opportunity to acknowledge and seek serious corrective steps to heal the "historical trauma" suffered by Aboriginal peoples








Rural Realities


immigrant attraction

- » innovative thinking








Re-embedding wealth to place
